When he joined up with us as staff 3 or 4 years ago now he wasn't sure at first where he fit in, but he really wanted to help us reach youth in the Oxford Hills and surrounding area. He started with just bringing in a few models, setting up a table to see how much interest there would be. He had boys and girls alike gathering around the table to build models, talk cars, and receive ministry through this giant of a man with a big soft heart to reach the youth.

Plum took the Connecting Rodz on the road this year for our winter retreat in Feb. and it was a great hit. Maury Blake

made up a logo/sign for the Connecting Rodz that is part of the display every week he sets up his big long table in the multi-purpose room with a mound of models, paint, glue etc. Plum comes prepared to minister to the youth in whatever way the Lord opens the door. Plum also gives away a gift that has something to do with cars each week through a drawing, that the youth sign up for if they stop by the table and talk about cars. He has a big green model car with the roof removed that has been made into the item the names go into. When Plum describes the item he almost always has a story or an experience that goes along with it. It is quite often a small replica of a vehicle, and he can be found whispering in the youth's ear that won the prize what it is, the motor size and horsepower and any other details that stand out about this particular vehicle. Those of us at staff can sometimes identify with the year and make as it was in our era.....whoops showing our age.

In closing if you have a young person boy or girl that loves working on model cars stop in from 6:00-8:30 PM on Friday nights and talk about cars while building yours. As the Executive Director of this ministry I would not be surprised in the future to see them working on real cars. Let's see what God does with this. About His Place Teen Center!

His Place Teen Center going into our 17th year of ministry reaching out to youth in the Oxford Hills and surrounding area. Phase I that opened in March of 2001. A 26' x 52' unique two story gambrel style building, with our new Phase II 36' x 70' addition (less than \$30,000.00 to complete) located on a 2 1/4 acre lot on 254 Webber Brook Road in Oxford. We're open every Friday night from 6:00-9:00 PM. We then have our Outpost starting at 9:15 PM and is open to anyone that wants to attend. The first Sat. night of every month 6:00-8:00 PM Outpost, no games). All are welcome to attend. For those that are new to us, His Place is a safe, yet well supervised place for youth ages 11-18 both boys and girls (NO ADMISSION FEES). We offer 2 pool tables, ping pong, foose ball, air hockey, Playstation I & II video games, various board games, and of course loud kicking music, with free refreshments. We also have a snack bar with very reasonable prices. We have a softball field, horseshoe area, a 30' x 60' paved basketball court and a 30' x 50' volleyball pit. We provide a safe place for the youth to meet new friends. We currently have about 40-50 youth in attendance and growing every Friday night. “Where Junk becomes Treasure”! We are well into our second year of operation and sincerely thank everyone that helped us. On May 1st of last year we opened in a meager 16' x 24' building and quickly outgrew it in a month. Fast forward to now, we now have a 24' x 60' double wide mobile unit, that came from Schiavi Leasing, (formerly used as portable classrooms around the state). We also put in electricity for heat, lights, and to allow us to make sure things worked as they are dropped off. We held our own through out the winter months and believe this helped spread the word we are here. We now have approximately 1440 square feet of floor space to shop in and have had a great response from the Oxford Hills and surrounding area to both donate and to shop and save, at the Alpha & Omega Thrift Shop. In this tough economy we believe the need will increase even more. We get some real nice items that people can get many more years of use from that would have been discarded into the trash. We estimate we are taking over 3-5 tons out of the system a month that would have been in land fills.

The Alpha and Omega Thrift Shop has been instrumental in helping people save money, thus providing needed funds to help with the increasing operational costs at His Place Teen Center and reaching our youth. It also has helped provide a more livable wage for Bert and Fran as Directors, (Bert has been full time for going on 4 years now), and help with the cost of running a ministry like ours. We get a big variety of donated items, (consisting of everything from household items, general merchandise, furniture, baby items, clothes, books, etc.) This merchandise comes in from all over the Oxford Hills and surrounding area and is helping to meet a need in the community. It has been proven in other parts of the state that recycling with thrift shops saves the towns and tax payers money. We are seeing a great response to our efforts and thank everyone that has given items to us and that shop and save with us. Tell all your friends to come visit us at the Alpha & Omega Thrift Shop.

Directions to Alpha & Omega Thrift Shop

We are located (inside the Norway/Paris Solid Waste facility) on 39 Brown Street in Norway. Take the road (across from Amato's and on the corner of the Oxford Networks building and Cafe Corner). Go down Brown Street about 1/4 mile, drive through the NPSW facility and you will see us just down over the hill on the right on your way out of the plant. This is just a little over 2 1/2 miles from the teen center located on 254 Webber Brook Road in Oxford. If you need help call 515-3000.

The Alpha & Omega Thrift Shop is managed by Bert Rugg, along with Sue Bowen and is run by a volunteer staff of faithful people from the surrounding communities. Come visit and meet the volunteers, Tues: Dot Stevens, Wed: George Phinney & daughter, Ellen and Sue Bowen, Fridays: Maureen Simmons and daughter Michelle, Saturdays: Mary Lovejoy, these volunteers really make this place tick.

We are looking for more volunteers, even a 3 hour shift helps. We are pleased to be helping recycle good salable merchandise that would otherwise be thrown out. Thrift shops are very popular and cropping up all across the state. If you need help contact Bert at 515-3000.

Our hours of operation are 10AM-4:00 PM. Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays. This makes us open every day the NPSW facility is open as they are closed on Mondays and Thursdays. We are closed on Sundays to honor the Lord.

We have a 48' storage trailer the folks at NPSW let us use to store merchandise in. This is easily accessible and is planned for items going to the big yard sales on Rte. 26. We also have the 53' storage trailer, we got from the folks at Schiavi Leasing for a low price. These trailers are now both located at the NPSW location.

The 53' storage trailer will be used to store items earmarked for the thrift store. and the furniture and better items that are donated to keep them safe. This trailer is right along side the 48' one and is also easily accessible to load and unload merchandise.

We are now accepting good salable appliances, stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, furniture, especially dressers, bureaus, beds, Queen and twin beds are in big demand, tables, chairs etc., kitchen items, nick nacks, toys, good clean clothes etc. We say if it will sell we can sell it! The thrift shop and our big yard sales on Rte. 26 really help us. Another great thing about this outreach it provides a place for the youth to volunteer some time, learn a good work ethic, and help us reach their peers. The Outpost Saturday Night Service 6:00-9:00 PM takes place the first Saturday of the month to give an opportunity for the people that can't stay for the Friday night service. These Outpost meetings are growing, and staff and youth alike look forward to the time we spend learning about God and worshipping him in all we do.

His Place Teen Center Goals!

We are less than \$30,000.00 from completing our Phase II addition. Once this is complete we will have built a (\$500,000.00 facility) replacement value, all paid for with no mortgage in just 10 years since we purchased our property in Sept. of 1998.

It is our goal to complete our commercial kitchen with a new expanded counter in our snack bar area, put down a good tile floor, (tile floor is now in as of April 30th., trim, paint ect. We also plan to complete our Multi-Purpose Room with a good tile floor as well, trim, paint etc. This room is being used a lot now with the Outpost meetings, Alpha Course on Thursdays, and Friday night activities. We also want to complete our ladies bathroom. We are presently working on the men's bathroom and have the fixtures in place. We are using funds that came in for this cause through the Norway-Paris Kiwanis Club. We also have our food pantry off the kitchen to get in place and the hallway and entrance area where people enter the building. We have a little more work to do outside with some vinyl siding and closing in the eaves out back etc. Once we complete this work it will leave our Fitness Room with showers, this is located just off the Multi-Purpose room and has been in the plans for years. This will most likely be done next year unless funds are provided earlier. We also will have a 16' x 20' room over the Multi-Purpose room and another 16' x 14' class room upstairs to build. If we are able to complete all this by the end of August 2008 I believe this will be a great goal and we will be ready to minister to the youth and put all the programs in place we have dreamed and envisioned since beginning in August 1992.

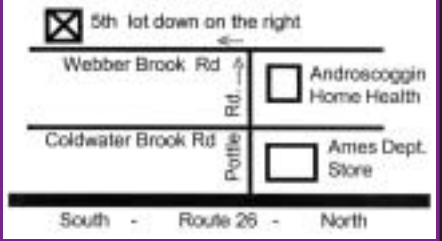
